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Yes, I'd agree with afire, this should be the "21" logo.

Joyce: this is indicating that this watch is incorporating a US made higher end 21 jewel movement. These watches were mainly produced mid fifties, so it should be a bit older than you expected. This should be a Strap 812 from 1953/54. It is part of the 1953 "All Star" series which was introduced late 1953 and sold under the sales name "Gruen Celebration". Introduction price was \$59.50, the SRP was \$69.50. Crystal and strap are replacements, but in very good shape, the band comes pretty close to the original.
