I've always been a fan of old wood, but it does create a need for front lighting.

The watches could be shelved as shown (watch face forward), in a crate deep enough to accommodate the max strap length. Some interlocking dividers (wood or plexi), and you're able to shelve many watches in a small space, hung vertically on a wall. Easy to add a hinged plexi or glass door, with a notch in in the crate wall to accommodate a swiveling or geared lock bar.

If I were Mrs. Gaines, I'd find a way to incorporate shiplap!


