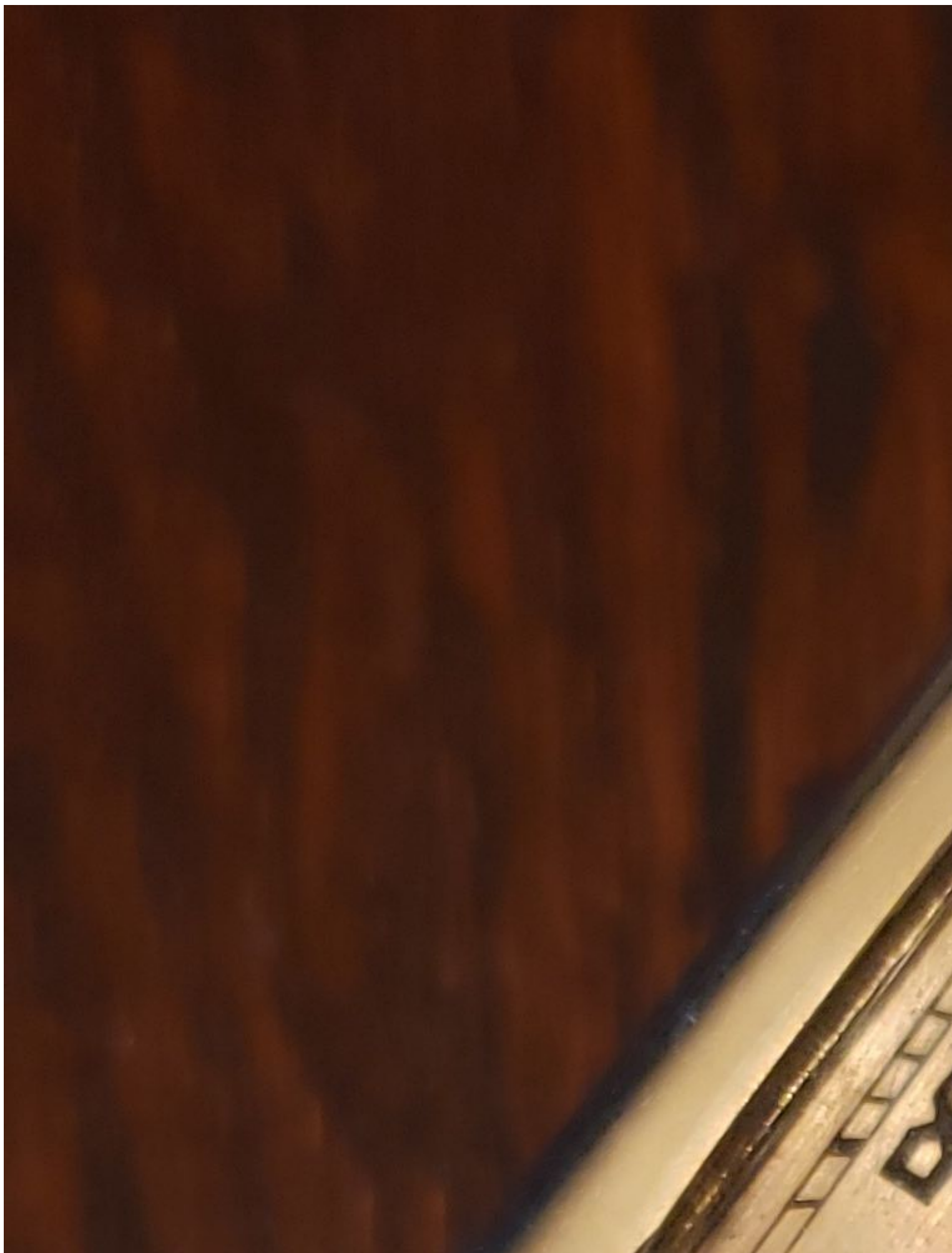

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All those figures on the dial should be hard enamel. If you are considering to send it out, you might just try to polish the dial yourself. Place a sunshine cloth on a hard flat surface and then gently go back and forth with the dial, following the lines on the dial already. Go slow, take your time and it should work. When done, wash gently with soap and water.

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I can confirm that this dial type is tough and that you will have great difficulty damaging the enamel. The cleaning after you're finished is the most important part!

Depending on the level of dirt accumulated between 10-30 seconds. They come out shining like new. I have posted in the past many before-after examples including non-enamel dials.
