TED KLUSZEWSKI, big-muscled Cincinnati Redlegs slugger, grins happily over this watch-in-the-bat presented him by the Gruen Watch Company to mark his walloping 47 clouts for the 1955 season. The solid gold shockproof autowind watch, one of Gruen's sleek but rugged Continentals, was inscribed in gold on the face of the dial to "Ted Kluszewski, Cincinnati's All-Time Home Run King." Major league home run leader in 1954 with 49 homers, Kluszewski, former All-American Indiana University grid star, makes his home in Cincinnati, headquarters of the generations-old makers of precision watches.
