Gruen "Belmont" -- Smartness through simplicity is the keynote of this 17-jewel Gruen masterpiece. Smart new SUN-GOLD case.

But looking at actual watches in the wild, they all appear to be white gold, green gold, or yellow gold. And of course, coins are yellow gold. So, I think that's all it really means.
