Searched in the Official catalogue of swiss watch repair parts.

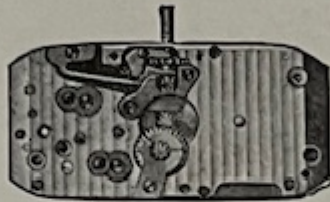
caliber number also in the range of proven favre calibers 1xx.

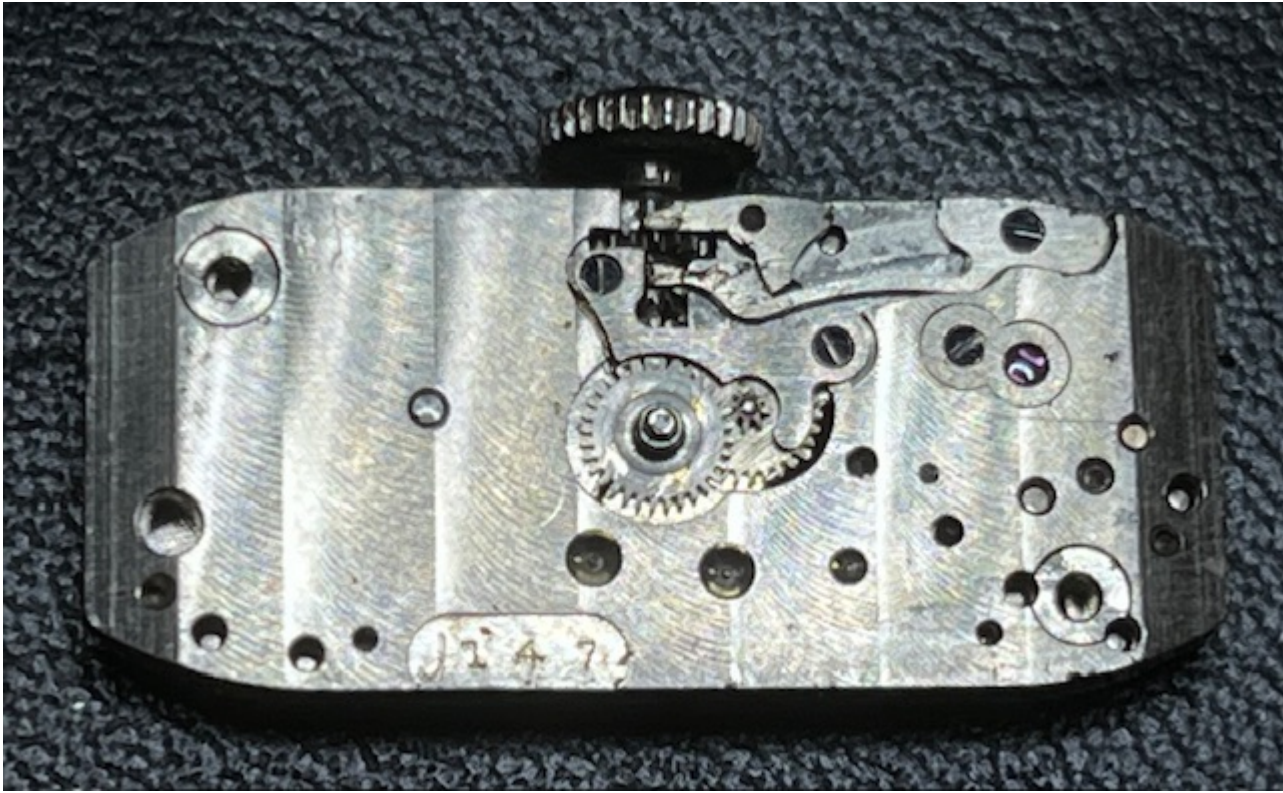

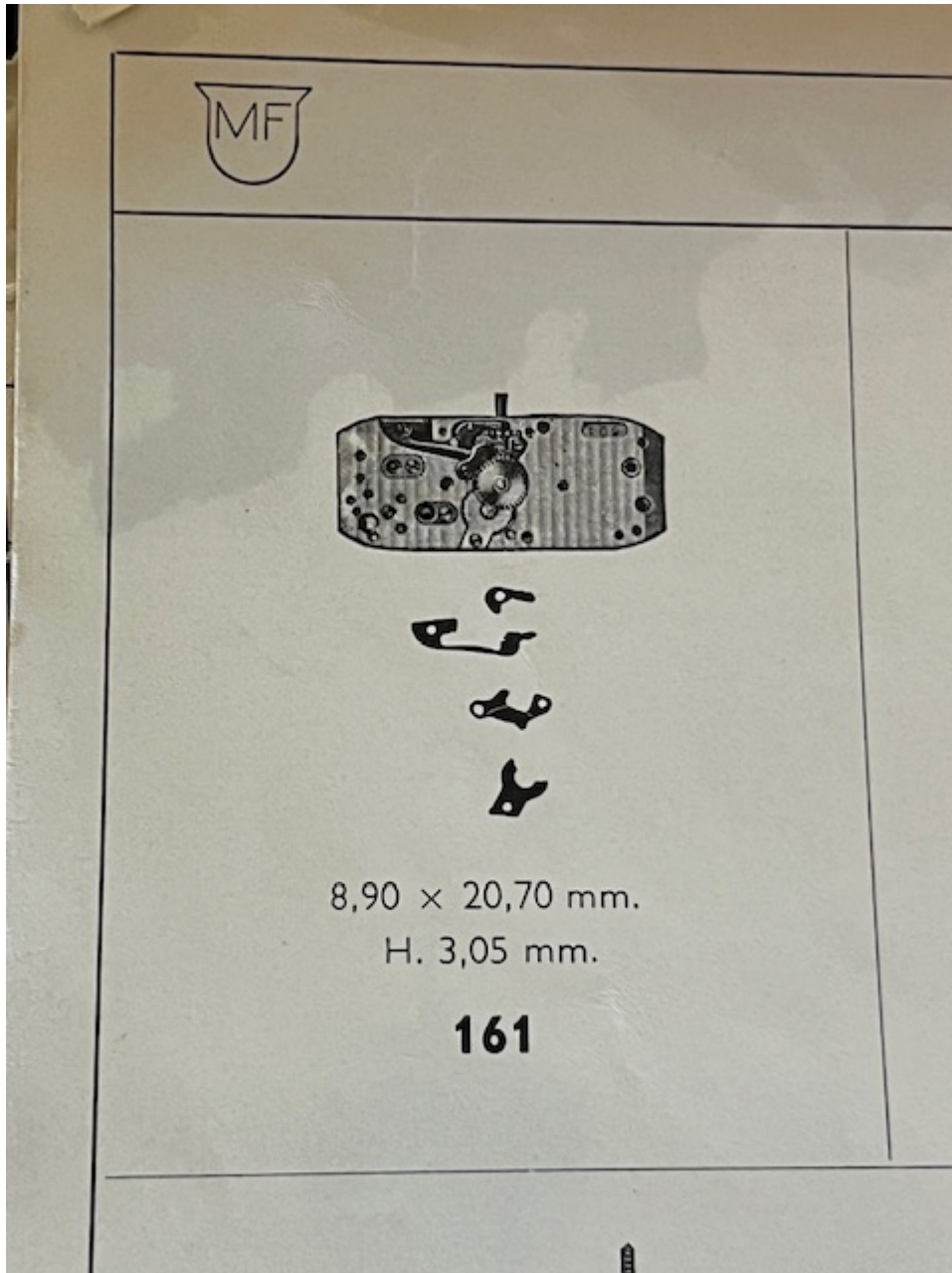
